Purpose

To provide the occupational physician, nurse and allied health personnel with recent information that will assist them in providing improved health care to workers and management.

Objectives

Upon completion of this two-day seminar, the participants should be able to:

- Describe the knowledge content related to respiratory impairment rating in the AMA guides. Explain the fundamentals of quality disability evaluation, and relate clinical data to case issues.
- Discuss the procedures available from interventional treatments of the patient with workplace injuries and pain. Discuss rationale for these treatments based upon x-rays, MRI's, etc., including review of normal and abnormal results frequently seen.
- Recognize depression in the workforce and take initial steps in treatment of the depressed worker.
- Discuss treatments for drug and alcohol rehabilitation.
- Discuss aspects of current research of fatigue causation and recall incidences of fatigue as related to aircraft accidents. Discuss the pros & cons of "power naps" by pilots on long duration flights. Review fatigue factors in space flight.
- Discuss how case law and interpretation of the statutes by workers compensation courts reflect on compensability of workers compensation claims.
- Delineate the relationship between obesity and cost of care.
- Discuss recovery post cardiovascular procedures, including fitness for duty, activity level, and long-term exercise routines.
- Discuss treatment options for SLAP lesions, and the necessary rehabilitation before return to work.
- Identify possible psychological diagnoses that result from workplace injury versus frivolous requests for workplace leave.
- Discuss the diagnosis criteria and treatment for occupational and environmental asthma. Determine the common causes of occupational asthma.

Carroll Paul Hungate, M.D. 1904-1981

In 1977, Dr. Hungate organized the first Occupational Health Seminar presented by the Great Plains Occupational Medical Association. He was the Program Chairman for the Seminar again the following year.

In 1979, The Association named this Annual Postgraduate Seminar on Occupational Health for Carroll P. Hungate, M.D. It did so in recognition of his leadership and invaluable contributions to the Association.
